## General Data Protection Regulation (Regulation (EU) 2016/679)

- Adopted on 27<sup>th</sup> April 2016
- Implemented across the EU by 25<sup>th</sup> May 2018
- Affects all organisations subject to EU data protection legislation

The most significant change in data privacy regulations in 20 years



## Six key principles:

- 1. Lawfulness, fairness and transparency processes clear and accessible to the data subject (you and me)
- 2. Purpose limitation only used for explicit purpose for which it is held
- 3. Data minimisation limits the amount of data held to absolute minimum
- 4. Accuracy regular checks on quality of data
- 5. Retention no longer than its intended use
- 6. Integrity and confidentiality data security

Legal requirement for security breach notification

Key impacts

Data protection issues must be addressed in all information processes

Specific requirements for transparency and records of fair processing

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Tighter rules on 'consent'
