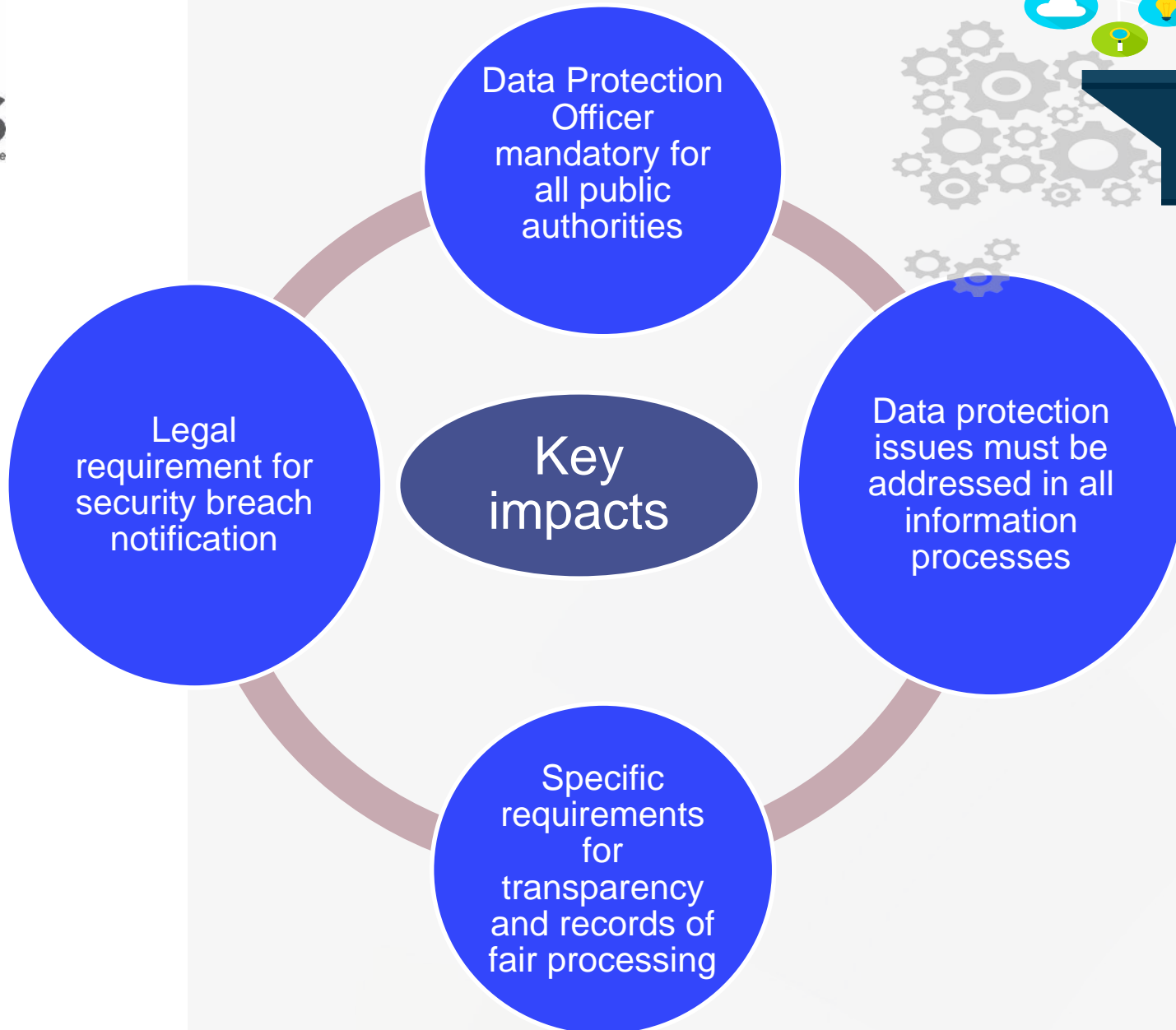
General Data Protection Regulation (Regulation (EU) 2016/679)

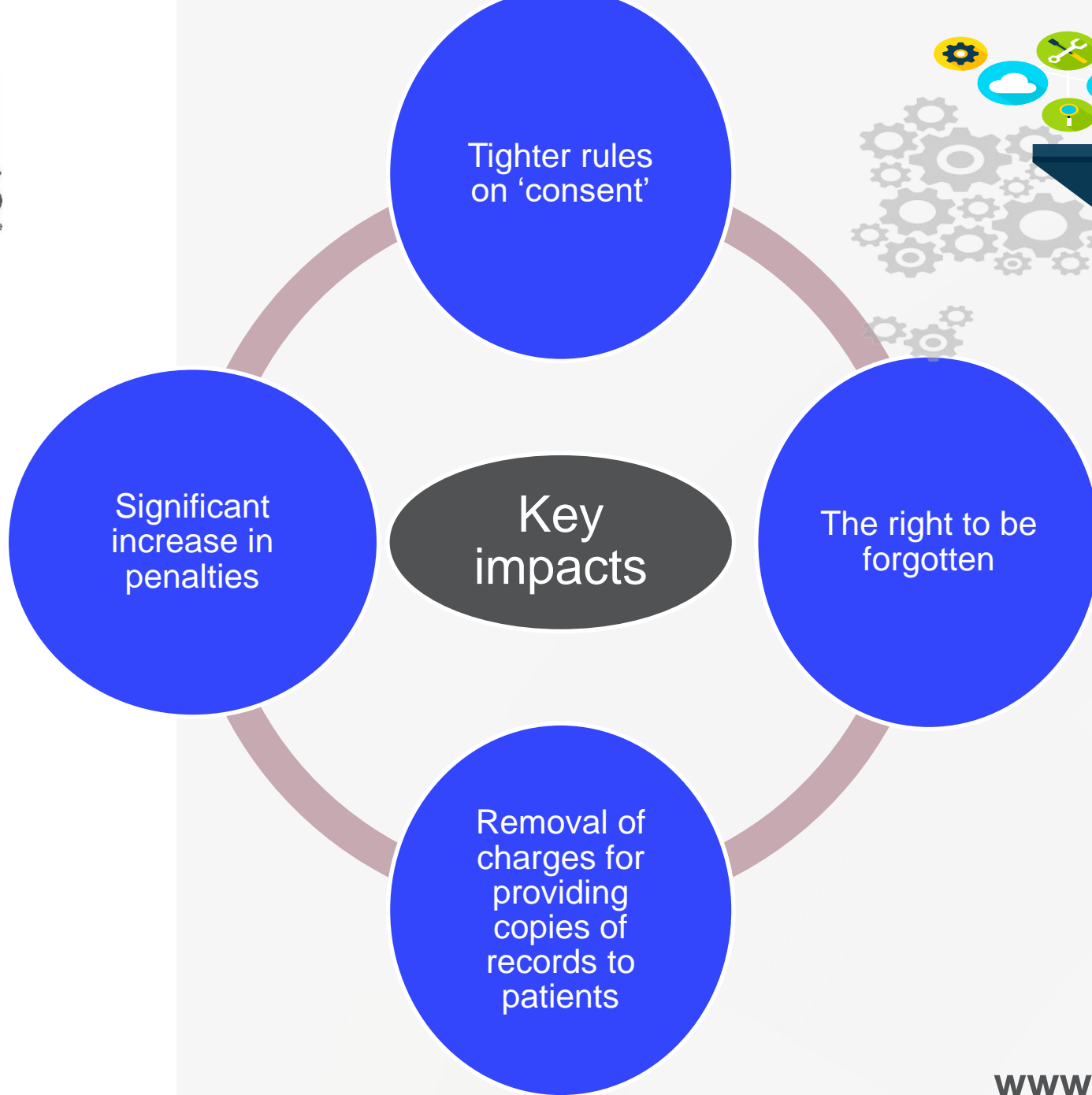
- Adopted on 27th April 2016
- Implemented across the EU by 25th May 2018
- Affects all organisations subject to EU data protection legislation

**The most significant
change in data
privacy regulations
in 20 years**

Six key principles:

1. Lawfulness, fairness and transparency – processes clear and accessible to the data subject (you and me)
2. Purpose limitation – only used for explicit purpose for which it is held
3. Data minimisation – limits the amount of data held to absolute minimum
4. Accuracy – regular checks on quality of data
5. Retention – no longer than its intended use
6. Integrity and confidentiality – data security
